



Eligibility Checklist

- □ Received Medicaid coverage for 24 months within a 36-consecutive month period between age nine and high school graduation.
- Complete application (via MiSSG Student Portal or phone) before August 31 of the year you graduate.
- Obtain a high school diploma or its recognized equivalent prior to age 20.
- Must be a Michigan resident and a U.S. citizen, permanent resident, or approved refugee.

Eligibility

To be eligible for the Tuition Incentive Program (TIP), a student must have received Medicaid coverage for 24 months within a 36-consecutive month period between age nine and high school graduation. The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) determines which students are Medicaid eligible and transmits this information to Student Scholarships and Grants (SSG). A student must activate TIP within four years following completion of high school or its recognized equivalent, or they forfeit their TIP benefits. TIP expires six years after completion of high school or its recognized equivalent. Students must have a high school diploma or its recognized equivalent prior to age 20.

Application

Once identified as TIP eligible, the student will be sent notification to the address on file with DHHS. The MiSSG Student Portal will also reflect the student's TIP eligibility. Students must complete the application by logging into the MiSSG Student Portal at **www.michigan.gov/missg** or by calling 1-888-4-GRANTS (1-888-447-2687). The application must be completed by August 31 of the year the student graduates.

TIP Phase I Covers:

- The cost of tuition credit hours at the standard in-district rate at participating Michigan community colleges. Contact hours and tiered tution rates are not covered.
- The cost of tuition credit hours at the lower level resident rate at participating Michigan public universities.
- The average community college rate per credit hour is available at participating degree-granting independent non-profit colleges, federally tribally-controlled colleges, or Focus: HOPE. Contact SSG for the current academic year's rate.
- · Mandatory fees up to \$250 per semester/term.
- TIP benefits cannot exceed 80 semester or 120 term credits (24 semester or 36 term credits per academic year).

TIP Phase II Covers:

- Tuition and mandatory fees not to exceed \$500 per semester or \$400 per term up to a maximum of \$2,000 for credits earned during a four-year program.
- Student must have completed at least 56 transferable semester of 84 transferable term credit hours.
- Must be used within 30 months of Phase I completion.

Community Colleges	Eligible charges include standard in-district tuition and mandatory fees. TIP does not cover contact hours or tiered tuition rates. For persons residing in an area that is not included in any community college district, the out-of-district tuition rate may be authorized. Some community colleges are authorized to offer bachelor's degrees. Contact your institution to see how this may impact your TIP eligibility.	
Public Universities	Eligible charges include lower level resident tuition and mandatory fees for the current year. Reminder: The student must be enrolled in an associate degree program or a minimum one year-long certificate program to be eligible for TIP Phase I benefits.	
Independent Colleges and Universities	Eligible charges include mandatory fees for the current year and a per credit payment that does not exceed the average community college standard in-district per credit tuition rate. Contact SSG for the current academic year rate. Reminder: The student must be enrolled in an associate degree program or a minimum one year-long certificate program to be eligible for TIP Phase I benefits.
